- (1) This rate is computed on the graduates who entered program during the five years of 2011/2012 to 2015/2016. Indebtedness includes students in this group who did and did not take out loans.
 - (2) This is the amount for two years of tuition and fees for a full-time student enrolled fall and spring terms for two based on the 2016/2017 rate of \$19,600 with a 3% annual increase; DOES NOT take into account grant and scholarship financial assistance. Because the average hours enrolled per term for all students in the program during this time frame was 12.2 hours, full-time tuition was used. About a third (28%) of the students' semesters had enrollments of part-time.
 - (3) This is the amount for two years of (a) books and supplies of \$2,500 per year. It does NOT include the cost room and board cost of \$9,100 per year as the students in this program all live off campus.
 - (4) This rate is computed on the graduates during the five years of 2011/2012 to 2015/2016 who either (a) obtained jobs or (b) enrolled in graduate school within one year of graduation. Because students in this program are all working nurses, the rate will always be 100%.
 - (5) The number of students completing the program is fewer than five during this period. The data will not be reported for privacy reasons. Please contact the Dean of the Elliott School of Nursing for more information regarding this program, (606) 218-5750.
 - (6) This information comes from the Kentucky Center for Education & Workforce Statistics, 603 Wilkinson Blvd, Frankfort, KY. All credential earners from AY 2008 to AY 2014 are included. Average wages are calculated by summing the wages for the 2015 Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) for applicable individuals and calculating a median wage for each group.
 - (7) The number of students completing the program and working in Kentucky is fewer than five during this period so KCEWS didn't release the income data.
