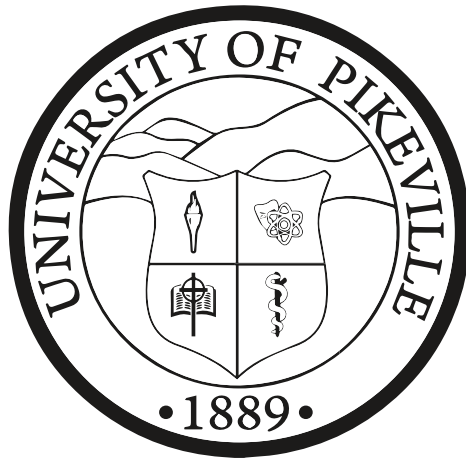

He opened the Roseboro office in 1986, the Benson practice in 1998, and expanded to Clinton in 2003. He opened his newest practice in Elizabethtown in 2019.
