

# Two-year Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) Program RN Applicant Checklist

### **Application Deadlines:**

October 1, 2023 to be considered for the two-year ADN program -Spring 2024 start. March 1, 2024 to be considered for the two-year ADN program - Fall 2024 start.

All admission requirements must be completed on or before October 1, 2023 (for Spring admission) or March 1, 2024 (for Fall admission). The TEAS nursing entrance exam is required as part of the application process and is registered for and given online (see instructions in this packet). If not admitted to the nursing program in either semester and you want to apply in the future, you must complete a new application packet. Application materials are not kept from one semester to the next.

TEAS Nursing Entrance Exam (register and pay on-line; exam is proctored remotely)
No minimum score required, but ranking points are only awarded for scores of 55 or greater. Performance on this test will be taken into consideration as part of the overall criteria for acceptance. Retakes are <b>not</b> allowed. Cost of the exam \$115
Official transcripts of GED, high school, college/university (ALL colleges/universities ever attended) submitted to the University of Pikeville Office of Admissions. High school students should include transcripts for dual credit completed.
University/college GPA of 2.0 or higher. Includes dual credit courses.
For high school seniors: Your high school transcript will be evaluated on GPA, rank, grades in science and math courses and attendance. No ranking points are awarded for high school courses.
Indicate whether or not you are interested in the Rural Health Nursing Fellowship.

#### **NOTES:**

- 1. The only prerequisite courses for admission to the nursing program are completion of preparatory Math and English courses, if required by ACT or equivalent scores.
- 2. Courses in the major must be at least a "C" grade and only repeated one time. The grade on the second attempt, including "W" grades, may stand as the final grade. Transfer credit is subject to approval of the Registrar's Office.
- 3. Required science courses must be within the last 10 years. Otherwise, the science course must be repeated.
- 4. Any exception will be determined on an individual basis.

If you check "Yes" above, you will receive a <u>PMC Rural Health Nursing Fellowship Student Agreement</u> ("the Agreement"), by email. Signing the Agreement does not guarantee your admission into the UPike nursing program or into the Fellowship, but your willingness to participate in the Fellowship will be a consideration of the UPike nursing program selection committee. PMC reserves the right to grant or deny admission into the Fellowship and you will not be admitted into the Fellowship unless PMC also chooses to sign the Agreement. If you are not admitted int the UPike nursing program, PMC will not sign the Agreement and you will not be admitted into the Fellowship.

<u>Students applying for readmission</u> (only necessary if one semester or more has passed since original admission) should write a *letter of petition* to the Nursing Admissions Committee explaining failure to progress in the nursing program and what has been done to remedy the situation and attach letter of petition to this application. These letters are read by the committee members and considered in the decision to readmit. They should, therefore, be well crafted. Students applying for *readmission* do not have to repeat any entrance exam. Only one nursing course failure/readmission to the nursing program is allowed.

The A.D.N. program has approval status from the Kentucky Board of Nursing (KBN). The KBN may delay or deny anyone who has been convicted of a felony or a misdemeanor from taking the nursing licensure examination. The university and affiliating agencies may require a criminal background check and drug screen. These agencies have the right to deny a student's clinical placement based upon findings of the criminal background check or drug screen. Should this situation occur, the school of nursing does not guarantee the student's placement in the nursing program or at an alternate site and the student may need to withdraw from the program.

Progression in the nursing program is dependent on completion of required activities by deadline dates, adherence to nursing program policies, completion of required remediation based on standardized tests, "C" or higher grade in pre-/corequisite and nursing courses, and final "Satisfactory" rating in the clinical portion of nursing courses.

It is the policy of the university that no student shall be excluded from participating in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in any program sponsored by the university because of gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, age, handicap or national origin. Students with disabilities requiring accommodations should contact the Disabilities Resources Office located in the Student Services Counselor's Office. Accommodations are made on an individual basis according to documented need.

## TEAS Nursing Entrance Exam Information

Completion of the TEAS Nursing Entrance Exam is one of the admission criteria to the Elliott School of Nursing's associate degree nursing program. The TEAS Nursing Entrance Exam is taken online and proctored remotely. You will choose the date and time of your exam from available dates, but it needs to be completed prior to the application deadline.

## To register for TEAS Nursing Entrance Exam.

- The cost of this remotely proctored online exam is \$115; paid online when you register.
- Step 1: Visit atitesting.com/teas/register and create a user account. If you already have an existing account, proceed to Step 2.
- Step 2: Once you are in the online store, find the "Register For" section in the left-hand navigation and select TEAS. Online sessions will be noted by a Remote Proctoring label. Our institution is listed as **U** of **Pikeville**. It is very important that you choose the correct institution so that we will receive your transcript.
- Step 3: Check your email! Following registration, you will receive an email confirmation from ATI. This includes test information and system requirements.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE TEAS EXAM

- The TEAS is taken once per admission year. There is no cut-off score, however ranking points are not added until a score of at least 55 is achieved. **No retakes are allowed.**
- Be sure to remember your username/password combination of your ATI account you create. The proctor will not have or be able to retrieve that information.
- Valid picture identification is required. You will be asked to identify yourself on camera.
