

Two-year Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) Program RN Applicant Checklist

Application Deadlines:

October 1, 2025 to be considered for the two-year ADN program -Spring 2026 start. March 1, 2026 to be considered for the two-year ADN program - Fall 2026 start.

All admission requirements must be completed on or before October 1, 2025 (for Spring admission) or March 1, 2026 (for Fall admission). A minimum ACT composite score of 19 **or** TEAS minimum score of 55 is required. A student with an ACT composite of 19 or more is <u>not</u> required to submit a TEAS score. If a minimum ACT of 19 is not submitted, the TEAS nursing entrance exam is required as part of the application process and is registered for and given online (see instructions in this packet). If not admitted to the nursing program in either semester and you want to apply in the future, you must complete a new application packet. Application materials are not kept from one semester to the next.

University of Pikeville Nursing Program Application (pp. 3 – 5 of this packet)

_ ACT composite score of 19 <u>or</u> TEAS Nursing Entrance Exam score minimum of 55 Retakes of the TEAS are **not** allowed within one calendar year. Cost of the exam \$120

Official transcripts of GED, high school, college/university (ALL colleges/universities ever attended) submitted to the University of Pikeville Office of Admissions. High school students should include transcripts for dual credit completed from the relevant institution. Transfer students from other nursing programs also require 2 letters of recommendation stating that they are eligible for readmission.

Submission of ACT or TEAS score is required of all applicants, however, students who have neither an ACT of 19 or TEAS of 55 will be <u>considered</u> for admission if they have demonstrated success in college coursework with a cumulative University/College GPA of **3.0** or more and at least **14 hours** of required nursing support courses completed.

Current college students: You must be in academic good standing at the time of application (University/College GPA of 2.0, including dual credit courses). Cumulative GPA of <2.0 will not be considered and applicants will be directed to raise their GPA and reapply.

Current high school seniors: Your high school transcript will be evaluated on GPA, rank, grades in science and math courses and attendance. No ranking points are awarded for high school courses.

NOTES:

- Courses in the major must be at least a "C" grade and only repeated one time. The grade on the second attempt, including "W" grades, may stand as the final grade. Transfer credit is subject to approval of the Registrar's Office. Transfers from other nursing programs must be eligible for readmission to previous program.
- Any exceptions will be determined on an individual basis.

NURSING PROGRAM APPLICATION

Completion of this nursing program application is one of the admission criteria to the Elliott School of Nursing's associate degree in nursing program. Please refer to RN applicant checklist and nursing brochure for a complete list of admission criteria to submit by the application deadline.

All admission requirements must be completed on or before October 1 for spring admission or March 1 for fall admission. If required due to absent or low (<19) composite ACT score, the TEAS Nursing Entrance Test must be taken prior to the deadline for the semester seeking admission. If not admitted to the nursing program and you want to apply in the future, you must complete a new application packet for the new application cycle. Application materials are not kept from one semester to the next. TEAS scores are good for one year.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

October 1, 2025 – to be considered for admission to the Spring 2026 semester. March 1, 2026– to be considered for admission to Fall 2026 semester. Application for readmission is only necessary if there has been a semester without enrollment in the program.

Students may then be offered a <u>PMC Rural Health Nursing Fellowship Student Agreement</u> ("the Agreement"). PMC reserves the right to grant or deny admission into the Fellowship and you will not be admitted into the Fellowship unless PMC also chooses to sign the Agreement. If you are not admitted into the UPike nursing program, PMC will not sign the Agreement and you will not be admitted into the Fellowship.

<u>Students applying for readmission</u> (only necessary if one semester or more has passed since original admission) should write a *letter of petition* to the Nursing Admissions Committee explaining failure to progress in the nursing program and what has been done to remedy the situation and attach letter of petition to this application. These letters are read by the committee members and considered in the decision to readmit. They should, therefore, be well crafted. Students applying for *readmission* do not have to repeat any entrance exam. Only one nursing course failure/readmission to the nursing program is allowed.

<u>Students applying for transfer from another nursing program</u> must be eligible for readmission to their original program of nursing. Depending on reason for transfer, there may be only one admission (no opportunity for readmission) to the Elliott School of Nursing offered.

Effective April 1, 2024, this nursing program is a candidate for initial accreditation by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing. This candidacy status expires on April 1, 2026.

Note: Upon granting of initial accreditation by the ACEN Board of Commissioners, the effective date of initial accreditation is the date on which the nursing program was approved by the ACEN as a candidate program that concluded in the Board of Commissioners granting initial accreditation.

The A.D.N. program has approval status from the Kentucky Board of Nursing (KBN). The KBN may delay or deny anyone who has been convicted of a felony or a misdemeanor from taking the nursing licensure examination. The university and affiliating agencies may require a criminal background check and drug screen. These agencies have the right to deny a student's clinical placement based upon findings of the criminal background check or drug screen. Should this situation occur, the school of nursing does not guarantee the student's placement in the nursing program or at an alternate site and the student may need to withdraw from the program.

Progression in the nursing program is dependent on completion of required activities by deadline dates, adherence to nursing program policies, completion of required remediation based on standardized tests, "C" or higher grade in pre-/corequisite and nursing courses, and final "Satisfactory" rating in the clinical portion of nursing courses.

It is the policy of the university that no student shall be excluded from participating in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in any program sponsored by the university because of gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, age, handicap or national origin. Students with disabilities requiring accommodations should contact the Disabilities Resources Office located in the Student Services Counselor's Office. Accommodations are made on an individual basis according to documented need.

TEAS Nursing Entrance Exam Information

The TEAS is required only if the applicant has not submitted an ACT composite score of at least 19.

Completion of the TEAS Nursing Entrance Exam is one of the admission criteria to the Elliott School of Nursing's associate degree nursing program and is only required in the event of failure to submit a minimum ACT composite score of at least 19. The TEAS Nursing Entrance Exam is taken online and proctored remotely. You will choose the date and time of your exam from available dates, but it needs to be completed prior to the application deadline.

To register for TEAS Nursing Entrance Exam.

- The cost of this remotely proctored online exam is \$120; paid online when you register. •
- Step 1: Visit https://www.atitesting.com/teas and create a user account. If you already have an existing account, proceed to Step 2.
- Step 2: Once you are in the online store, find the "Register For" section in the left-hand navigation and select TEAS. Online sessions will be noted by a Remote Proctoring label. Our institution is listed as U of Pikeville. It is very important that you choose the correct institution so that we will receive your transcript.
- Step 3: Check your email! Following registration, you will receive an email confirmation from ATI. This includes test information and system requirements.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE TEAS EXAM

- The TEAS is taken once per admission year. A minimum score of 55 is required. No retakes within a 12 month period are allowed.
- Be sure to remember your username/password combination of your ATI account you create. The proctor will not have or be able to retrieve that information.
- Valid picture identification is required. You will be asked to identify yourself on camera.
- Remote proctoring requirements:
 - Browser: Google Chrome

 - Microphone: Any microphone, either internal or external
 Webcam: 320 x 240 VGA resolution (minimum); internal or external
 Internet Speed: .5 1.0 Mbps. Test your internet speed using <u>www.speedtest.net</u>
 Clear your internet browsing history and cookies before starting the test
