This position will be responsible for planning and administering all aspects of both Men's and Women's Track & Field and Cross Country.

Responsibilities:

- 1. Recruit and retain qualified student athletes.
- 2. Reach roster goals yearly while staying within scholarship parameters.
- 3. Coaching the team during scheduled practices and competitions.
- 4. Demonstrating competitive accomplishment.
- 5. Providing leadership and direction for all team members.
- 6. Maintaining responsibility for budget control with all program expenditures.
- 7. Mentoring student athletes in their academic performance to ensure timely progress toward degree completion and graduation.
- 8. Directing the program within the NAIA rules and regulations.
- 9. Develop a schedule for competition.
- 10. Oversee assistant coaches, volunteers, graduate assistants, and study students.
- 11. Manage budget, supplies, equipment and inventory.
- 12. Maintain receipts and reconcile department credit card monthly.
- 13. Organize travel accommodations and team meals.
- 14. Ensure the health and safety of athletes and staff.
- 15. Schedule events for team community service.
- 16. Attend all departmental meetings.
- 17. Follow the department guidelines and regulations for operation.
- 18. Work collaboratively within the framework of the department and institution.
- 19. Other duties as assigned.

Relationships:

Position requires daily contact with athletes, parents, faculty, staff, student workers, coaches, and community members in order to exchange information. These relationships are maintained through e-mail, telephone, and person-to-person contact.

Education/Skill Requirements:

- 1. Bachelor's Degree required. Master's Degree is preferred.
- 2. Demonstrated success in coaching collegiate track & field and cross country.
- 3. Ability to operate a collegiate track and field program within budget parameters.
- 4. Effective verbal and written communication skills are essential. 5. Must be willing to deal with student athletes, university personnel and members of the off campus community.
- 5. Must maintain a valid driver's license.
- 6. Must be familiar with Microsoft Office, particularly Word and Excel.
- 7. Must be able to perform simple calculations.

Work Conditions:

The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job: The noise level in the work environment is usually low to moderate.
