Of the total number of male full-time, degree-seeking undergraduate students (601) enrolled at the University of Pikeville in 2024-2025, 61 percent participated in at least one intercollegiate athletic program (not including coeducation programs).

Of the total number of female full-time, degree-seeking undergraduate students (632) enrolled at the University of Pikeville in 2024-2025, 34 percent participated in at least one intercollegiate athletic program (not including coeducation programs).

Estimated Loan Indebtedness upon Graduation

58% of the baccalaureate Class of 2025 who entered UPIKE as a first-time freshman borrowed at any time through any loan programs (institutional, state, Federal Perkins, Federal Stafford Subsidized and Unsubsidized, private loans that were certified by UPIKE; excluding parent loans). This includes both Federal Direct Student Loans and Federal Family Education Loans. The average per-undergraduate-borrower cumulative principal borrowed was \$24,950.
